# Golden Steer shows way

**SUPERFISH** Emily Steer has won two gold medals at the state age championships and helped Galston Park Swim Club to one of its strongest ever showings at the Homebush event.

Emily, 14, claimed her first

state title in the girls 14s 200m backstroke (2.20.46) and 100m backstroke (1.06.54).

"The first one was amazing," Emily said. "I had been working towards winning one of my races for so long and then when I won the second race by milliseconds it was the best feeling."

As part of the 31 swimmers sent to represent the club, Kaea Bidois won silver in the boys 11s 100m backstroke (1.13.59), while Patrick Walsh took bronze in the boys 12s 100m breaststroke (1.19.21).

Jordan Campbell and Michael Pearson also achieved qualify-

ing times for the 2012 Australian age championships, to be held in Brisbane on April 9.

They will join Emily and club captain Damian Yabsley, who had already qualified.

Emily, who trains six times a week, said everyone in the team had worked hard.
